Tips for Getting Around Without Driving:

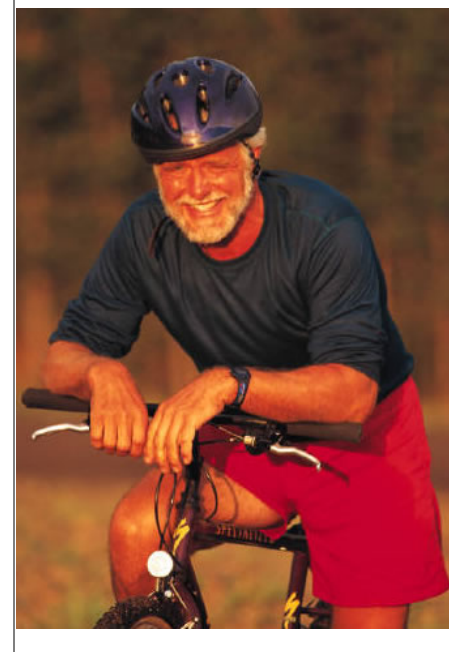
- Public transportation;
- Shuttle buses or vans;
- Taxi cabs (find out if there are companies in your community that offer discounts to seniors);
- Local community-based services;
- Carpooling, walking, relocating.

In addition to the transportation options mentioned above, there are alternatives to leaving the home for routine errands:

- Many stores deliver products directly to your door, including groceries, for free or a small fee;
- Ask family, friends, or neighbors for help running errands, doctor visits, etc;
- Order medications by mail from pharmacies that you know and trust;
- Have meals delivered;
- Shop from mail order catalogs

The Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles recognizes that transitioning to a daily routine without the driving privilege can be difficult and frustrating.

Many people manage well without a car. Depending on the community, there are often special transportation programs available that can help senior and disabled persons who do not drive and cannot use public transportation.

Remember, transportation services vary among communities; experiment to find out what works best for you. For more information on services in your community, look in the Yellow Pages under Community Services for Senior Citizens, Senior Organizations, or Transportation, and check the listing of resources in this pamphlet.



SOUTHERN NEVADA

Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada:

Citizens Area Transit (CAT) Fixed Route

There are 48 fixed routes throughout Southern Nevada. All CAT vehicles are ADA accessible. Seniors and riders with disabilities may be qualified for a discounted fare. Customer Service: 1-800-228-3911 or 702-228-RIDE (7433) TDD: 702-676-1834

CAT ADA Paratransit Services

This program was developed as a shared-ride, public transportation service for people with disabilities who are unable to independently use the CAT Fixed Route System. Customer Service: 702-228-4800

CAT Silver Star Currently, there are eleven Silver Star neighborhood routes available which connect with a regular CAT fixed route. The eleven routes were designed with senior citizens in mind, with designated stops at assisted living facilities, age restricted communities and various shopping locations. RTC RIDE is the public transit bus system of the greater Reno/Sparks area, providing residents and visitors with safe and reliable bus service.

RTC ACCESS is the paratransit service that provides door-to-door, prescheduled transportation for people who meet the eligibility criteria of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). RTC ACCESS passengers have disabilities which prevent them from riding RTC RIDE independently some or all of the time.
