Re: One Year Extension on Nevada Driver's Licenses

Dear Nevada Driver License Holders 65 years of age and older:

To ensure the continued health and safety of our valued customers and staff, the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) has reopened its offices to serve customers using an appointment only system. As a result, appointment dates and times are beginning to extend beyond the expiration dates of expiring or already expired driver licenses.

In an effort to further assist our customers 65 years of age and older, the DMV has issued an automatic 1-year extension of a driver license (non-commercial and commercial) held by these individuals.

Please note, you are still required to renew your driver license on time. This extension is to allow time for you to schedule an appointment and should that appointment extend beyond the expiration date listed on your license, you will be exempt from late fees and penalties for the late renewal.

As an example, if your driver license expired on July 15, 2020, you now have an extension until July 15, 2021 to allow you to schedule an appointment for as soon as possible to complete your driver license renewal.

This extension will begin on the date of expiration listed on your driver license. You should carry this letter with your DMV issued document at all times as proof of eligibility for the automatic extension.
