

## HOW TO...

### **MAINTAIN YOUR ODOMETER CERTIFICATION EMISSION EXEMPTION**

Motorists that own vehicles meeting the requirements to make application for/ and or renewal of, Classic Vehicle [NRS 482.3816](#), Classic Rod [NRS 482.3814](#) or Old Timer [NRS 482.381](#) license plates, may complete an Odometer Certification for Emission Exemption" if specific requirements are met. These requirements include:

#### Application for original registration:

- Vehicle is being licensed as a "Classic Rod", "Classic Vehicle" or "Old Timer"
- The vehicles odometer must be operable
- Owner completes form EC-18, Odometer Certification for Emission Exemption.
- Note: If application is being made and the vehicle has a "failed" emission inspection on file. The Department is prohibited from issuing a Classic Vehicle, Classic Rod, or Old Timer license plates for a period of 90 days after the vehicle failed the emissions inspection

#### Application for renewal of registration:

- Registration renewals may be done in person at a DMV office or by mail.
- Owner completes form, EC-18 (Odometer Certification for Emission Exemption), certifying the vehicle has not been driven more than 5,000 miles during the current registration cycle. The completed form must be provided, with all other registration renewal documentation.
